PROJECT SEARCH MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS (NOT LIMITED TO)

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Meet eligibility requirements for Oregon Vocational Rehabilitation Services.
- Meet eligibility requirements for the State of Oregon Developmental Disabilities Services or Brokerage services.
- Pass a drug, health screen, and criminal background check.
- Ability to communicate effectively with reasonable accommodations.
- Must have Benefits Counseling prior to start of program.

Project SEARCH Application

Thank you for your interest in Project SEARCH! Project SEARCH is an **unpaid internship** that lasts for 9 months. The program serves adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities that need an intensive year of career development, internship experience, and support to reach their goals. The program embraces interns that have other disabilities (such as: physical and mental health disabilities) and challenges (such as: poverty and homelessness) as well.

To apply you must be:

- Minimum 18 years old and graduated from high school with a regular diploma.
 - Or
- No longer eligible for transition services (i.e., graduated with a modified diploma) by the beginning of the program.
- Enrolled in or Eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) services.
- Receiving or Eligible for Developmental Disability support services.
- Provide vaccination records.
- Pass a Tuberculosis (TB) test and background check.
- Eligible to work in the US.

There are 4 steps to the process.

Step 1: You must complete [this application](#) then email it to:

Step 2: The Project SEARCH Selection Team will:

- Gather documents and information from any school and agency contacts listed.
- Review these and consider your strengths, needs, and eligibility.
- Decide if you can move forward in the process.
- Inform you and your guardian (if applicable) of next steps.

Step 3: If you are eligible to move forward, you must participate in the skills assessment day.

- This is June 30th. Time and location to be determined. **Please add this date to your calendar.** We will give you more details about this later.
- Please note any conflicts with the dates above.

Step 4: The Selection Team will:

- Review the skills assessment and prior information, and then select the interns for the next year.
- Contact you and your guardian (if applicable) to let you know if you are accepted.
